## Scope and Content Note

The collection contains the records of the New Hampshire Federation of Garden Clubs (hereafter called the Federation or NHFGC) from the mid-1930s through the early 1970s, including scrapbooks, ledgers, reports, publications, plant inventories, and information on special events.

## Institutional Background

The New Hampshire Federation of Garden Clubs was organized on May 23, 1933 and incorporated on January 13, 1964. According to the organization's website mission statement, "The New Hampshire Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc. provides education, resources and statewide networking opportunities for its members to promote the love of gardening, floral design, civic beautification and environmental responsibility". [http://www.nhfgc.org/]. The membership of the organization is comprised of local garden clubs throughout the state. The Federation is a member of National Garden Clubs, Inc. It is currently active and publishes a journal called Lilac Letter.

## Provenance

The collection was given to the New Hampshire State Library by the Federation in several increments over time, and there may be additional donations in the future. On record are gifts made in 1950, 1955, and 1960.

The Federation also made several gifts of gardening books and periodicals to the state library in the 1960s and 1970s. Records of these gifts are included in the collection.

In the summer of 2013, two additional cartons of materials from the Federation were discovered behind unrelated collections. It is believed that these were donated at the same time as the rest of the collection but were somehow separated. The boxes contained additional annual reports and organizational documents, as well as publications of the Federation, plant inventories and surveys, and material from the national organization and other states. The contents were integrated into the existing collection and the finding aid was revised accordingly.

Span Dates: 1930s to 1970s.

## **Collection Strengths**

This collection contains the history of the organization and its member clubs. Because the NHFGC is currently active, the collection is a resource for the Federation as well as for others interested in the history of garden clubs in New Hampshire.

## **Collection Size**

The collection contains 9 archival boxes (5 letter-size full boxes, 1 legal-size full box, and three archival pamphlet boxes), 6 scrapbooks, the organization seal, a poster of the Federation library's bookplate, and designs for the creation of a garden for the NH governor. It covers approx. 4.5 linear feet, not including the poster and garden design.

**Condition of the Collection:** Most of the documents are in good condition and can be used with only the usual precautions. Extra caution should be used with the scrapbooks and newspaper clippings, as these are brittle. Scrapbook 5, covering 1950-1951, was in extremely brittle condition, with news clippings pasted onto acidic pages which were breaking and crumbling. The scrapbook pages and the image on the cover were scanned and burned onto a CD-ROM in pdf format. The member club pamphlets which had been in scrapbook 5 were placed in the envelope with the CD-ROM. The original brittle pages were discarded.

## Copyright Status and Access

The collection is the property of the New Hampshire State Library and may be viewed upon request to the library staff.
