Scope and content: The collection comprises materials relating to Rev. Jacob White's ministry in the Congregational Church of Lyndeborough, New Hampshire from 1836-1840. Contents consist of correspondence to and from White, his sermons and notes, verses of hymns probably written by him, and papers of the church, including a Bill of Mortality which lists the names and date of deaths of members of the church, as well as a church covenant, probably written by White.

Biographical Background: Jacob White was born in East Bridgewater, Massachusetts on November 20, 1806. He graduated from Brown University in 1932 and from Andover Academy in 1835. He married Eliza Ann Rider of West Bridgewater on January 6, 1839.

From 1835 until 1840 he supplied the church in Lyndeborough, being dismissed on June 30, 1840 with favorable letters of recommendation from the church council (see Folders 1 and 4).

Rev. White retired to Massachusetts and died on April 3, 1865, during a visit back to Lyndeborough.

Provenance: The collection probably came to the New Hampshire State Library from the Houghton Library at Harvard. The collection includes a piece of cardboard addressed "To New Hampshire State Library" upon which is noted "W.A. Jackson, Harvard Library". It is accompanied by a handwritten note which offers the collection to NHSL. Since Jackson was the librarian at Houghton Library from 1942-1964, it may be assumed that the papers were donated to NHSL at some point during his tenure.

Span Dates: ca. 1836-1840.

Collection Size: The collection is contained in one legal-sized archival box $(27 \times 39 \times 7 \text{ cm.})$, or about .25 linear feet.

Copyright status: The collection is owned by New Hampshire State Library and may be viewed by request.
